## Passwords: From Simple to Super

## Purpose: Understand the difference between strong and weak passwords.

Can you tell the difference between a strong password and a weak password? First, color and cut out the signs on the next page that say WEAK and STRONG. Now, get your signs ready! Raise your WEAK sign when your teacher shares a password that you think is weak. Raise your STRONG sign when your teacher shares a password that you think is strong.

Take a look at the tips below for clues!


## What's the difference between strong and weak passwords?

Strong passwords use a combination of letters and numbers and are hard for others to guess. A strong password can be based on a word or phrase that you can remember.

Example: "I went to Jones Elementary School for grade 3" could be used to build a password like: Iw2JE\$4g3

Weak passwords include personal information such as your name or favorite sports team. Weak passwords are easy for others to guess.

Example: GoEagles! or Ilikechocolate


Challenge: When you identify a weak password, talk about ways to make it stronger!
